The ACP Club is committed to protecting the privacy of its members in accordance with applicable personal data legislation and other applicable legislation.

On this page we inform our members about the processing of personal data. The Privacy Policy below explains what information we collect and what we collect and use the information for. It also explains in more detail the rights of members and how we protect our records.

ACP Club Privacy Statement

It is our fundamental principle to collect as little personal data as possible. Its use is aimed at enabling communications to reach members, to provide services and, on a temporary basis, for example, to organise events. No data will be disclosed to third parties.

Our personal data files contain information on current and former members and those who are essential to our activities. Personal data may be collected in different ways.

We collect and process personal data that you provide to us when you join as a member, update information during your membership, register for our events, act as a judge or trainer at our events or write an article for our publication. The retention period for non-member data is five years.

By joining the ACP Club, an individual gives consent to the processing of personal data in this clause. The following information will be collected in the Members' Register and published in the Members' Newsletter:

- First name and surname
- Home address
- Place of residence
- Country
- Telephone number
- E-mail address
- Possible kennel name and website address

Traditionally, the club has published membership details in the magazine. To have your personal details published in the members' magazine we ask for your separate consent.

If a member resigns from the ACP, the resignation will be processed by the ACP Board and the personal data will be deleted when the resignation takes effect.

There is no obligation to provide us personal data, but if you choose to do so, we may not be able to provide all of our services to you.

We do not transfer data outside the EU or EEA. However, data may be transferred outside the EU or EEA within the services we use, but only within services that guarantee a level of data protection that complies with the European Data Protection Regulation when data is moved across a global infrastructure (for example, Google).
